


# Strengthen.



My partners and I lost our bar which at that time was thriving, and my job, as well as my contract with a network, were both affected. For a while, I felt my self-esteem being challenged as everything just happened so suddenly. I've never expected to face a pandemic in my lifetime and certainly not during what was supposed to be the best year of my life. I was twenty-four, starting to create a name for myself, hoping to become an inspiration to other people, especially the youth, and I suddenly did not know what to do. But despite these challenges, I knew I needed to rise above the situation.

I took this as a test for my perseverance and resilience, and with that, I've come to realize that we cannot allow ourselves to wallow at the enormity of the pandemic. Rather as a hindrance, we need to face it and see this as the potential to grow.
